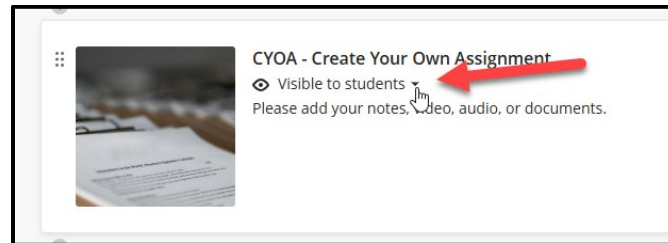


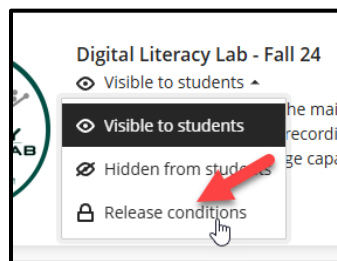


Gradebook - Add Submission Attempts to Release Conditions

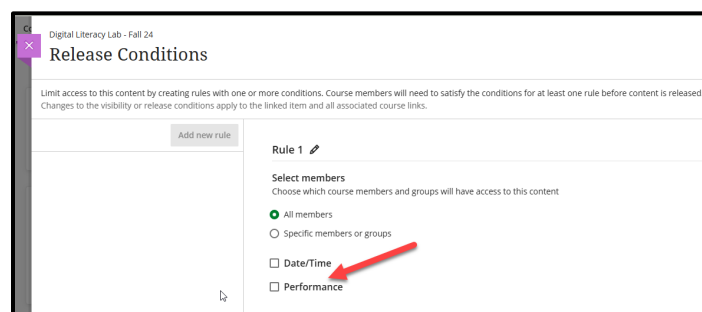
Instructors can now use item submission status for a release condition. For example, an instructor who wants students to access a document only after submitting a quiz would use a release condition. Students can access content items without needing to wait for a grade to be posted.



You can select the content module or component within to assign an adaptive release that requires a performance criterion to access. First, you will select the arrow to the right of **visible to students** and drop down the menu to **Release conditions**.



Click release conditions to access the rule options.



Choose **Performance** to access the gradable items list.

In the drop-down menu, you can now select **Attempt submitted** as an option. This allows the student to proceed once the item chosen in the gradable item has been submitted. This eliminates the delay with grading and having the student move on. Choose **Save** to complete the release condition.
